Additional costs

- \$250 approximately for a uniform

Entry requirements

- NCEA Level 2; or
- NZ2202 New Zealand Certificate in Tourism (Level 4); or
- NZ2204 New Zealand Certificate in Travel (Level 4); or
- a recognised equivalent.
- International applicants are required to have an IELTS score of 5.5 (general or academic) with no individual band lower than 5 from one test taken in the preceding two years, or an equivalent described in NZQA Rules.
- Special admission may be granted to applicants (aged 20 and over) with no formal qualifications but who are enthusiastic and motivated and have evidence of relevant prior learning and work or life experience.

Entry with credit

You may already have some knowledge or skills that can be recognised as part of your intended study. This may take a number of different forms including study while at high school, study at a private training establishment, workplace training or other tertiary study. If you think you may qualify, you may want to apply for Cross Credit (CC).

- CC is based in the equivalency of courses or qualifications. You would apply for CC if you have passed a very similar course at the same level.

You will be asked to provide details of anything that you would like to be considered as credit toward your intended programme of study, as part of your application.

You must apply prior to enrolment. CC cannot be awarded for a course if you are already enrolled in that course. An original transcript or notice of results from the institute at which you previously studied, (or verified copies) will be required for all applications.

Transfers/cross credits

This programme leads to the award of a nationally approved qualification. This qualification may be delivered at a number of other tertiary institutes around New Zealand. If you were to transfer to one of those other institutes you may be granted academic credit for some of the papers completed but this is at the discretion of the other institute.

Please note: Fees are not transferable between institutes.

Facilities

On the Hawke's Bay campus we have a Travel Centre, which is set up to simulate a travel agency and used for role plays.

Assessments

To receive the NZ Diploma in Tourism and Travel, you must achieve a grade of C- or better averaged across all of the summative assessments in each course. Every summative assessment within a course must be submitted to pass that course. Assessment is ongoing and will take any of the following forms:

- Reports, industry journal, case studies, test, exam, presentations, debates, assignments.



How to enrol

There is an easy 3-step process to follow when enrolling at EIT | Te Pūkenga.

Step 1

Check out eit.ac.nz to see the programmes available for you to study. A copy of the course information for each programme is available on our website.

Step 2

You can now use your RealMe verified identity to apply for study at EIT | Te Pūkenga. If you use your RealMe verified identity you will no longer be sent a copy of your application form to sign. You also will not need to provide us with a copy of your primary ID.

If you apply online without using RealMe then you will be sent a summary of your enrolment to check and sign. It will also include course selection forms which you need to complete and return. Your enrolment cannot progress until you have sent the summary and forms back to us.

You can also apply using a paper enrolment form. Please call us on 0800 22 55 348 and we will send you one out.

You will receive an acceptance letter from your Faculty with programme information. This will include the start date of your study and any special information regarding your programme. Depending on your chosen programme of study, you may be invited to attend an interview before you are accepted.

Step 3

Arrangement for full payment of enrolment fees must be made before the start of your programme. You will receive an invoice with payment details.

Fees-free government scheme: Tertiary education is fees-free for eligible domestic tertiary students. To check if you are eligible, go to FeesFree.govt.nz and enter your National Student Number (NSN). If you are not eligible you will be responsible for paying your fees.

Scholarships and grants: Scholarships and grants make life easier by helping to cover your fees, other costs and living expenses while you study. You don't always need to be an academic high-flyer to qualify. You can find out more about scholarships and other options for paying your fees at eit.ac.nz.

StudyLink: If you need to pay for your own study you can choose to apply for your Student Loan and Student Allowance with StudyLink. You should do this early, even if you haven't yet been accepted on your programme. You can change your details later if anything changes. Visit studylink.govt.nz to find out more about StudyLink.

Student services levy

The student services levy is a compulsory non-tuition fee that is charged to students enrolled at EIT | Te Pūkenga. The levy is to contribute to the provision of quality student services that support learning. The funds received by EIT | Te Pūkenga from the levy are ring-fenced, meaning they can only be spent on student services.

Student loans and allowances

The unit standards required for a Bar Managers Certificate (LCQ) are included in this qualification.

TOUR5101	Communications Practice in Tourism Learn to apply effective corporate communication skills in a range of practical contexts in the tourism industry, including online communication and e-marketing activities. Analyse and review a range of corporate communications from key tourism organisations according to a set of guidelines/criteria.	5	15
TOUR5102	Developing People in the Tourism Industry This course introduces learners to an understanding of the management of Human Resource practices in a tourism workplace, ensuring compliance with relevant Acts and legislation. Included is planning a team training and development activity.	5	15
TOUR5103	Tourism Industry Principles Gain an overview of tourism as an industry; from the big picture of global tourism, applying learning to national and local operating environments and identifying how the principles of tourism are applied to support decision making. Learners will also participate in a present and future trends debate.	5	15
TOUR5104	Destination Investigation Analyse and evaluate the key factors that drive and shape development of a destination. This course includes a practical component where learners will engage with tourism industry stakeholders during a familiarisation study tour of tourism operations at a specific New Zealand destination, currently planned for Waitomo Caves and Hobbiton.	5	15

TOUR5105	<p>Marketing in Tourism</p> <p>Learners will learn how to apply marketing principles and analysis to support effective marketing planning in a tourism environment.</p>	5	15
TOUR5106	<p>Tourism Business Development</p> <p>Learners will gain the skills and knowledge to enable them to develop a strategy to grow a tourism business. This includes a practical work placement of 60 hours where learners will experience real-world practice in a local tourism business.</p>	5	15
TOUR5107	<p>Fundamentals of Finance and Quality Assurance in Tourism</p> <p>Learn how to analyse and appraise information and data to develop quality assurance systems and how to analyse and evaluate financial data to improve business processes and overall effectiveness.</p>	5	15
TOUR5108	<p>Tourism Event Planning</p> <p>Learn about the events industry within the broader tourism context, and apply effective planning processes to develop a tourism event. This course includes a practical component where learners will get hands on experience of event systems and processes through volunteering at local events.
