The programme was originally founded in 2017 after no women put themselves forward for the NZ Winegrower's Board Elections. The New Zealand wine industry supports and encourages diversity, and there are many women working in the industry in all roles and at all levels - and we realised this needed attention.

This prize is to reward excellent performance in achieving an EIT B. VWSci.

✓ Prize Details

- > A Prize of \$1000 for the top student of the year studying B. VWSci
- > The first time this will be awarded will be April 2023 (for a student completing in 2022)
- > This will be an annual prize.
- > The prize will be awarded at graduation with a certificate

✓ Criteria

The applicant must be:

- Attain the highest average marks for the year
- ➤ A student of Viticulture and Wine Science at Eastern Institute of Technology ("EIT") or Te Pukenga (from 2023)
- > Be a student of B. VWSci qualification

✓ Conditions

- ➤ The PC and Staff will determine the eligible student and communicate the marks and performance of the student to the committee.
- In the event of a tie the committee will have the option to award 50-50 shares to the two students or choose one of the nominees as the prize winner.
