Who's this for?

Students must be enrolled in the Master of Health Science programme (180 credits).

In addition to Level 8 credits, students must enrol in a research thesis course at Level 9 of at least 90 credits.

What does it cover?

This scholarship covers the full fee (domestic student) for a research thesis course. This will allow a high-achieving student to carry out a research project utilising the state-of-the-art research facilities at the EIT ISH.

Eligibility Criteria and Application Details

1. Applicants for the scholarship must enrol in a Level 9 course of at least 90 credits (PGART9.900, PGART9.902 or MN9.490) in the Master of Health Science programme at EIT.
2. At the time of application, applicants must:
 - a. Have achieved a grade average of A- or above (or with Distinction) in the last year of a Degree, or hold a Postgraduate Diploma or an Honours degree at Level 8 from EIT or another New Zealand tertiary education provider.
 - b. Be a permanent resident or New Zealand citizen to be eligible to apply.
3. Applicants must complete the prescribed application form and must include the following:
 - a. A verified copy of their academic transcript.
 - b. A verified copy of the application to enrol into a Postgraduate course within the MHSc programme.
 - c. A brief description of the topic of research they will with intend to investigate in the research thesis course (200 words maximum).
 - d. A written statement by the applicant on how this scholarship will assist them in furthering their study and career (200 words maximum).
 - e. A recent, named photo.

The information requested in this application form will be used solely for the purposes of assessing your application for the scholarship.

EIT undertakes to store your application in a secure place in the event that you are successful in gaining the Scholarship. You have the right to have access and correct the information provided to EIT.
