### POINT OF CLARIFICATION SPECIFIC TO EIT

Please note the following points for clarification specific to EIT.

In Te Pūkenga Academic Integrity Policy:

- Section 3.4 – Register of breaches. The following reporting standards apply:
  - Actions resulting from internal moderation to ensure assessment design that encourages academic integrity and minimizes opportunities for plagiarism are reported to, and endorsed by, PCC.
  - Programme Cluster Committees maintain a register of academic Integrity breaches in order to identify and address areas of concern.
  - Annual Self-Assessment Reports (including any reporting on breaches of academic integrity) are submitted to the appropriate Programme Cluster Committee for approval.
  - Academic Committee receives a report on Programme Cluster Committees' breaches of academic integrity registers for action on any areas of concern.
- Section 4 – Reference to Programme Leads
  - Programme Leads are specific to Te Pūkenga Unified programmes and can be situated in any part of the network.
