Graduates will be capable of self-managing design projects to completion by applying technical skills and processes within briefs. Graduates will have the conceptual and practical skills that reflect current fashion design industry practices.

Entry Requirements:

Applicants under 20 years old

Will have completed a Level 3 qualification in a related field or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills.

Applicants 20 years or over

For applicants 20 years or over, there are no minimum academic requirements. However, applicants will need to provide their curriculum vitae detailing any relevant work experience and academic achievements. The Programme Coordinator will use this information to assess whether the applicant is likely to successfully complete the NZ Diploma in Fashion.

Facilities:

The Hawke's Bay and Tairāwhiti Fashion Studios are fully set-up with industrial equipment including design software and hardware, facilities for blog and web-design and sewing and fashion production machinery.

Adobe Photoshop and CAD software is taught in computer Labs.

Practicum and work experience:

Students will attend a field trip visiting the local fashion Industry.

Project 6 (FDIP 5.06), provides students with the opportunity of working with an external client for creation of unique products to Aotearoa New Zealand.

A portion of the programme involves students organising, planning and presenting a fashion collection in a Fashion Show.

Academic staff:

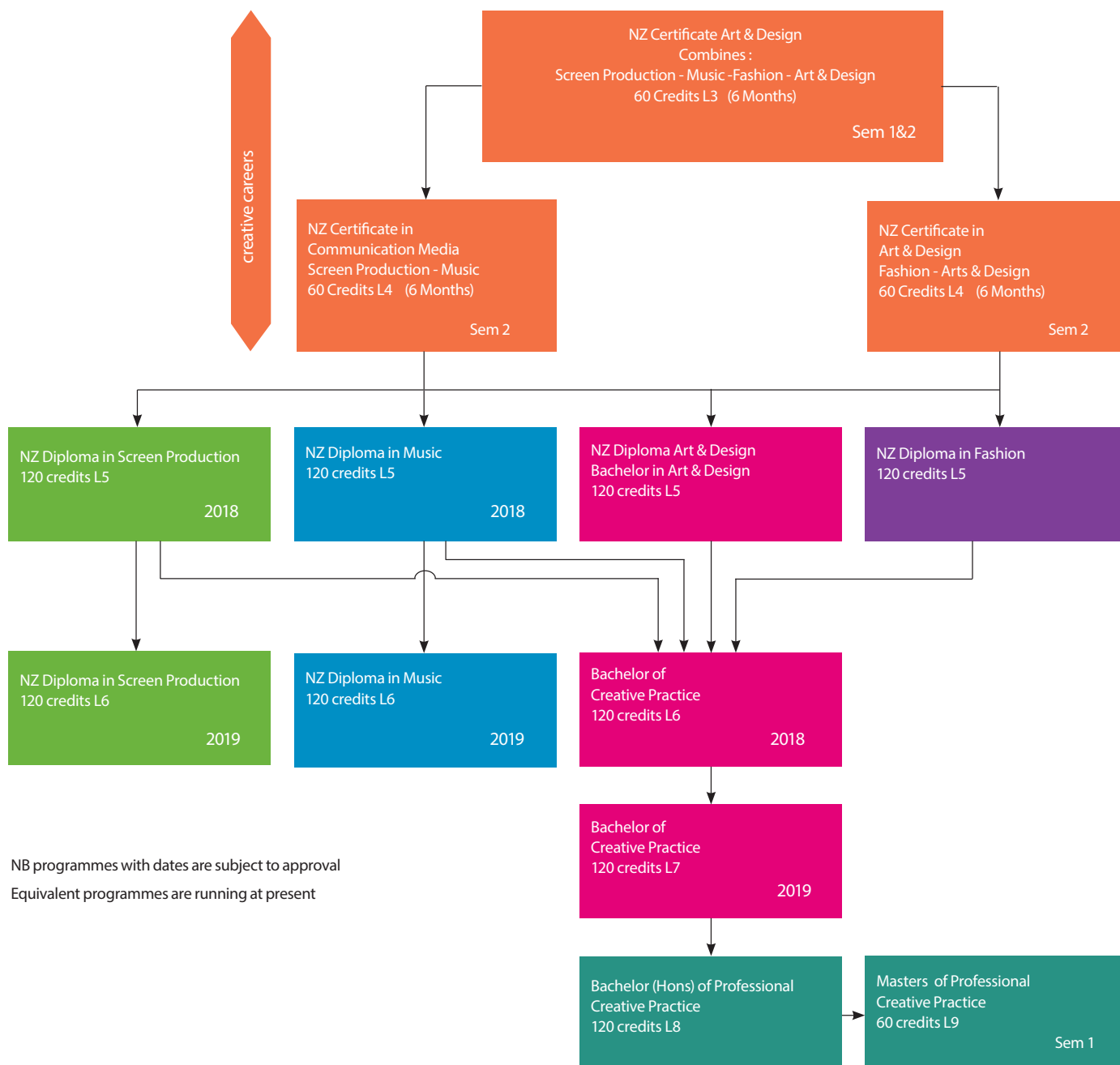

01 Complete and sign our international student application form

02 Attach certified copies translated into English of your:

- Passport or birth certificate
- Proof of name change (if applicable)
- Evidence of your English language proficiency ie. IELTS or equivalent
- Academic transcripts and qualification certificates

Please note that some programmes may require you to submit additional documentation such as your Curriculum Vitae, portfolio or references. Please check our website for any programme specific documentation required.

03 Send your application to us

04 We will assess your application and let you know the outcome as soon as possible

05 Pay your fees and apply for your Student Visa

06 Let us know your arrival details

Once your visa has been approved you can then book your flights. Please let us know your arrival details whether you'll be living in EIT accommodation or not. If you are staying in EIT accommodation, we will arrange for you to be collected from the Napier airport for FREE.

Please note that you must be 18 years of age or older when you begin your studies at EIT.
