Timetable

Your study time will be made up of contact time (class times and tutorials, and non-contact time (your own individual study time, online learning).

Contact Time

On-campus classes are usually scheduled between 8.00am-5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

Non-contact time

You should plan to spend 12-13 hours per week for each course on individual study.

Additional costs

Entry requirements

A personal interview is available as part of the application process. Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

Standard entry

- · Successful completion of NCEA (Level 2); or
- Successful completion of the NZ Certificate in Business (Accounting Support Services) (Level 4), the NZ Certificate in Business (Introduction to Small Business) (Level 3) or (Small Business) (Level 4) or the NZ Certificate in Business (Administration and Technology) (Level 3) or (Level 4); or
- An equivalent qualification including evidence of equivalent Literacy and Numeracy abilities as stated above.

If the applicant is 20 years or over:

- Evidence of relevant knowledge, skills and experience.
- In the latter two situations the applicant is required to participate in an enrolment interview with the purpose of verifying the evidence.

English language entry requirements

Applicants whose first language is not English must have an acceptable level of English language fluency prior to enrolment in the programme. This may be

demonstrated in a variety of ways, including schooling in New Zealand, completion of the relevant New Zealand Certificate in English Language, approved scores on IELTS tests or completion of accepted international equivalents.

Specific scores for IELTS and New Zealand Certificates in English Language are as follows:

- IELTS 5.5 Academic (no band score lower than 5.0)
- NZCEL Level 4 with an Academic endorsement

Entry with credit

You may already have some knowledge or skills that can be recognised as part of your intended study. This may take a number of different forms including: study at any other tertiary institution; life or work experiences; and workplace training can also be considered. If you think you qualify, you can apply for Cross Credit (CC) or Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).

- CC is based on the equivalency of courses or qualifications. You would apply for CC if you have passed a very similar course at the same level.
- RPL is based on the assessment of your current knowledge and skills. You would apply for RPL if you had gained the relevant knowledge and skills through life experiences and informal learning situations.
- · There is a fee for RPL.
- A combined total of CC and RPL credits allowed is 75 credits.



You will be asked to provide details of anything that you would like to be considered as credit toward your intended programme of study, as part of your

CC and RPL cannot be awarded for a course if you are enrolled in that course. An original transcript or notice of results from the institute at which you previously studied (or verified copies) will be required for all applications.

Facilities

Both campuses' have a pleasant environment for study with a range of general purpose rooms and lecture theatres all with data projector equipment. There are nine networked computer laboratories with 24 learner stations in each. The library provides plentiful computer work stations with seven day access for learners, group meeting rooms and a wide range of academic resources.

Assessments

All assessments in the NZ Diploma in Business (Level 5) courses are marked internally. Assessment is continuous throughout the semester, and may include a final test/examination for some courses.



How to enrol

There is an easy 3-step process to follow when enrolling at EIT | Te Pūkenga.

Step 1

Check out the programmes online at eit.ac.nz to see the programmes available for you to study. A copy of the course information for each programme is available online.

Step 2

You can now use your RealMe verified identity to apply for study at EIT | Te Pūkenga. If you use your RealMe verified identity you will no longer be sent a copy of your application form to sign. You also will not need to provide us with a copy of your primary ID.

If you apply online without using RealMe then you will be sent a summary of your enrolment to check and sign. It will also include course selection forms which you need to complete and return. Your enrolment cannot progress until you have sent the summary and forms back to us.

You can also apply using a paper enrolment form. Please call us on 0800 22 55 348 and we will send you one out.

You will receive an acceptance letter from your Faculty with programme information. This will include the start date of your study and any special information regarding your programme. Depending on your chosen programme of study, you may be invited to attend an interview before you are accepted.

Step 3

Arrangement for full payment of enrolment fees must be made before the start of your programme. You will receive an invoice with payment details. Fees-free government scheme: Tertiary education is fees-free for eligible domestic tertiary students. To check if you are eligible, go to FeesFree.govt.nz and enter your National Student Number (NSN). If you are not eligible you will be responsible for paying your fees.

Scholarships and grants: Scholarships and grants make life easier by helping to cover your fees, other costs and living expenses while you study. You don't always need to be an academic high-flyer to qualify. You can find out more about scholarships and other options for paying your fees at eit.ac.nz.

StudyLink: If you need to pay for your own study you can choose to apply for your Student Loan and Student Allowance with StudyLink. You should do this early, even if you haven't yet been accepted on your programme. You can change your details later if anything changes. Visit studylink.govt.nz to find out more about StudyLink.

Student services levy

The student services levy is a compulsory non-tuition fee that is charged to students enrolled at EIT | Te Pūkenga. The levy is to contribute to the provision of quality student services that support learning. The funds received by EIT | Te Pūkenga from the levy are ring-fenced, meaning they can only be spent on student services.
