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Kia rite!

This qualification is for people who want to develop some understanding of tikanga within a specialist field founded on a Māori worldview.

As a graduate of this qualification you will have some knowledge and skills to support and participate in the practice of tikanga under limited supervision.

Subject areas

- Learn about, and be immersed in, the traditional indigenous sport of waka ama
- Te reo me ōna tikanga
- Fitness and wellbeing for all ages, for whānau, hapū, iwi and local communities and health and safety

The programme will also cover content on:

- The history behind waka ama the ancient voyaging and navigation across and around the Pacific Ocean
- Practical learning of paddling technique, safety procedures and enhancing performance on the water
- · Living a healthy lifestyle

Career and study opportunities

Upon graduating you will be able to progress to:

 Level 3 or 4 Te Reo Māori / Waka Ama programmes, in particular Te Pōkaitahi Tikanga (Waka Ama) (Level 4) | NZ Certificate in Tikanga (Waka Ama) (Level 4).

Timetable

Your study time will be made up of contact time (campus classes and water-based training) and non-contact time (your own individual study time).

Contact time

Night classes are from 5.00pm-8.00pm (day/s to be confirmed) and three weekend wānanga (dates to be confirmed).

Non-contact time

You should plan to spend ten hours of individual study per course per week including scheduled classroom time.

Entry requirements

You must have completed:

- The approved foundation programme, Te Pōkaitahi Reo Māori (Reo Rua) | NZ Certificate in Te Reo Māori (Level 2), or
- Have an equivalent qualification.

English language entry requirements

All applicants must demonstrate an acceptable level of either te reo Māori or English language fluency prior to acceptance in the programme.

An interview is part of the acceptance process for international applicants where this will be discussed.

Entry with credit

You may already have some knowledge or skills (from other study or experience) that can be recognized as credit towards completing this programme. If credit is awarded, you may no longer be deemed a full-time student for allowances. Please enquire about this **before** you enrol.

Assessments

Assessments include oral, written and practical assignments. This programme is approved by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) but the programme does not consist of NZQA unit standards. It consists of NZQA approved "courses".

Facilities

Te Ūranga Waka - Hawke's Bay

The marae complex is primarily a teaching facility for Māori language and culture courses. Te Ūranga Waka facilities include a wharenui, kitchen, dining room, ablution area and new teaching spaces with video conferencing capability as well as a new art room and computer suite.

How to enrol

There is an easy 3-step process to follow when enrolling at EIT \mid Te Pūkenga.

Step 1

Check out **eit.ac.nz** to see the programmes available for you to study. A copy of the course information for each programme is available on our website.

Step 2

You can now use your RealMe verified identity to apply for study at EIT | Te Pūkenga. If you use your RealMe verified identity you will no longer be sent a copy of your application form to sign. You also will not need to provide us with a copy of your primary ID.

If you apply online without using RealMe then you will be sent a summary of your enrolment to check and sign. It will also include course selection forms which you need to complete and return. Your enrolment cannot progress until you have sent the summary and forms back to us.

You can also apply using a paper enrolment form. Please call us on 0800 22 55 348 and we will send you one out.

You will receive an acceptance letter from your Faculty with programme information. This will include the start date of your study and any special information regarding your programme. Depending on your chosen programme of study, you may be invited to attend an interview before you are accepted.

Step 3

Arrangement for full payment of enrolment fees must be made before the start of your programme. You will receive an invoice with payment details. **Fees-free government scheme:** Tertiary education is fees-free for eligible domestic tertiary students. To check if you are eligible, go to **FeesFree.govt.nz** and enter your National Student Number (NSN). If you are not eligible you will be responsible for paying your fees.

Scholarships and grants: Scholarships and grants make life easier by helping to cover your fees, other costs and living expenses while you study. You don't always need to be an academic high-flyer to qualify. You can find out more about scholarships and other options for paying your fees at eit.ac.nz.

StudyLink: If you need to pay for your own study you can choose to apply for your Student Loan and Student Allowance with StudyLink. You should do this early, even if you haven't yet been accepted on your programme. You can change your details later if anything changes. Student services levy
