# Our commitment to pastoral care



**The safety and wellbeing of all our learners is important to us. We have a wide range of support systems, services and resources available to ensure our international students are cared for and supported during their time with us.**

We're required by law to meet New Zealand's International and Domestic Pastoral Care Code, (the Code) which applies to all registered tertiary providers across the country. This is administered and monitored by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA).

An updated Code came into effect in January 2022 which mandates one set of clear rules and expectations for embedding safety and wellbeing into systems and day-to-day practices tailored to learners' needs.

## **Here's a summary of the Code as it relates to international students.**

Tertiary providers should ensure international students:

- are protected and supported from when they leave their home country, to when they finish their education journey
- are aware of their rights and protections
- feel safe and happy while studying in New Zealand
- are provided correct information through agents, who act professionally
- are aware of the terms and conditions of their enrolment.

# Support services

The availability of support services and facilities below is indicated for each of the three campuses in Napier, Auckland and Gisborne.

## International student support team

The International Student Support Team is the main support for all international students before they arrive and once they are on-campus and living in New Zealand.

The International Student Support Team is available for all questions, concerns or troubles, providing confidential and non-judgemental support, including a 24-7 emergency contact person.

Support is available for information on banking, driving in New Zealand, sexual health, homesickness and culture shock, travel in New Zealand and insurance – basically any question students may have about study and life in New Zealand.

The International Student Support Team also provides an accommodation placement service.

## International student mentors

Academic Mentors are available to support and assist international students in their studies. At the start of the semester, students will meet an International Mentor who will support them with any academic issues throughout the year.

## International student peer mentors and representatives

International students are also supported by our student Peer Mentors and Student Representatives at the Napier and Auckland campuses.

## International student enrolment officers

Our Enrolment Officers provide dedicated support to EIT | Te Pūkenga students through the process of student visa extensions, variation of conditions for work and study and post-study work visas. ## Academic learning services

Academic Learning Services assist students throughout their study by providing free one-on-one support; for example, in regards to study planning, computing, academic writing, learning, exam techniques and mathematical and study skills.

Disability Support Services and a Chaplaincy Team are also available if students require further support.

## Career development services

EIT | Te Pūkenga provides free one-to-one counselling on employment in New Zealand. Our specialised Careers Counsellors will help students in the following ways:

- Develop skills and knowledge to plan and manage their careers
- Provide information relating to the job market
- Provide information on job search strategies
- Assist with the preparation of job applications, including assisting with writing a CV and covering letter and completing online job applications

These regular sessions create a space for online and on-campus students to connect with each other and EIT | Te Pūkenga staff in an informal way.

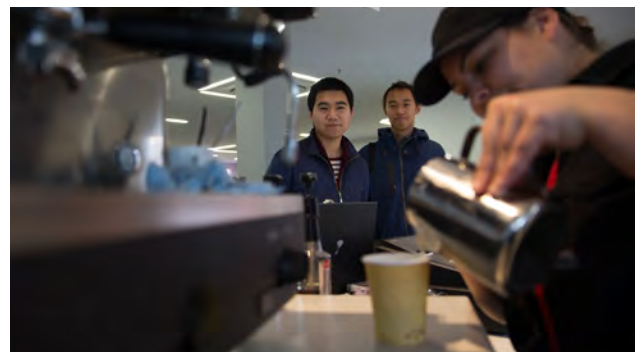

# Fees explained

## Tuition fees

Our programme tuition fees are outlined with the corresponding programme information on pages 5 and 7. The tuition fees listed are for programmes starting between 1 January and 30 June, 2024.

### Please note:

- The tuition fees listed are annual fees unless otherwise stated.
- Tuition fees include Goods and Services Tax (GST).
- Some programmes may have additional course-related costs. Please check individual programme information on our website for course-related costs not included in the tuition fees.
- English Language additional costs: e.g. IELTS exam entry fees.
- International tuition fees are reviewed each year. If a student is accepted into a programme of study that is longer than one year in duration, the fees in the second and subsequent years will not be known when the student first applies and enrolls. There may be a slight increase.
- EIT | Te Pūkenga reserves the right to increase tuition fees for the subsequent semester/year. We aim to inform students what the tuition fees for subsequent years are prior to enrolment for their subsequent semester/year.

## Other fees

### Student services levy

All students also pay a Student Services Levy. This covers student services provided to all EIT | Te Pūkenga students, such as sport, recreation and cultural activities, student advocacy etc. The Student Services Levy is \$364.00 for the full academic year.

Students who are only studying for a portion of an academic year will be charged the Student Services Levy on a pro-rata basis. The Student Services Levy will be identified in your invoice.

### Textbooks and stationery

Textbooks and stationery may be required for specific programmes. If required, students will receive a textbook list once they enrol in their courses and depending on the programme, textbooks can cost between \$500 and \$1,000 per semester. For programmes that do not require students to purchase any specific textbooks, New Zealand-specific content will be provided on the online study platform, EIT | Te Pūkenga Online.

## Living costs

The cost of living in Napier and Gisborne is generally cheaper than the larger cities in New Zealand. Students will need to budget their weekly expenses. Students may spend more or less depending on their individual circumstances, but EIT | Te Pūkenga staff members are also available to assist with budgeting information. It may take some time to secure a part-time job (if students are eligible to work in New Zealand), therefore it is important for students to have enough funds to cover living expenses for several months.

## Free for our international students

- Airport pickup from Napier or Gisborne (depending on campus of study). This service is for international students who move into homestay or other EIT | Te Pūkenga arranged accommodation.
- Orientation programmes are run at key entry points and are mandatory for all newly enrolling international students.
- Social events are scheduled throughout the academic year.
- Employment workshops are provided by the Career Development Service to help students find work.
- Our team provides placement in EIT | Te Pūkenga-managed accommodation in Napier and Tairāwhiti for those students who apply for this service. No application fee. This service is not provided for Auckland.

# Immigration and insurance

## Immigration

New Zealand Immigration Service requires a student to have at least NZ\$20,000 in their bank account to cover living costs for one year of study, plus a return ticket to their home country. Full details of visa requirements, advice on employment rights in New Zealand while studying, living costs and reporting requirements are available through the New Zealand Immigration Service and can be viewed on its website at **[www.immigration.govt.nz](http://www.immigration.govt.nz)**

## Medical and travel insurance

International students must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance from the time they leave home until the expiration of their student visa. EIT | Te Pūkenga can organise insurance for you with our preferred provider Studentsafe Insurance ([www.insurancesafenz.com/studentsafe](http://www.insurancesafenz.com/studentsafe)) brought to you by Marsh/Allianz. There is no insurance application paperwork to complete unless you have pre-existing medical conditions. Insurance fees are included in the invoice along with tuition fees.

Students should contact our Registry team as soon as possible if they decide to organise their own insurance as all insurance policies must meet a minimum standard of care and cover for Immigration New Zealand and Code of Practice requirements.

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. International students may be liable to pay the full costs of medical treatment in New Zealand. Full details on entitlements to publicly funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health and can be viewed on its website at **[www.moh.govt.nz](http://www.moh.govt.nz)** Students who do not choose EIT | Te Pūkenga's insurance must show evidence of insurance prior to departure from their home country to be able to enrol.

## Accident Insurance

The Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC) provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but visitors to New Zealand may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. - Indicate which programme you intend to study.
- Attach a verified copy of your birth certificate or passport to use as identification.
- Remember to include all other supporting documents.

We will assess your application and let you know the outcome as soon as possible, usually within three to five working days.

## On-campus study in New Zealand

### Pay your fees

After submitting your application, you will receive an Offer of Place by email with details of your tuition and other fees payable.

**Please note:** If you have applied using the services of an agent, a copy of this information will also be sent to your agent.

Pay your fees and apply for your student visa. We will send you a receipt, which you will need when you apply for your student visa.
